MidAmerican and power companies even from out of state are working hard to get this taken care of. They are working long hours because there are multiple cities affected by this unusual situation. Mayor Allen reported a serious boating accident occurred yesterday with one confirmed fatality. The DNR will be taking over following this tragic event. Mayor Allen commented Chad Pregracke has a unique idea on how to use the existing I-80 bridge in the future.

**WHEREAS**, Governor Kim Reynolds has allocated \$100 million of the State of Iowa's CARES Act funding to local governments for direct expenses incurred in response to the COVID-19 emergency; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City funding reimbursements may only be used for necessary expenditures incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic, were not accounted for in the current fiscal year City budget, were or will be incurred during the time period of March 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020 and have not been or will be reimbursed from other sources; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City certifies that all reimbursement amounts to be submitted will follow and adhere to the Federal and State of Iowa guidance on how the funds should be spent, and that if the funds are misrepresented, the City will be liable for repayment of said funds and any applicable penalties and interest.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of LeClaire, Iowa that the City shall request one or more reimbursements for eligible costs incurred. The first reimbursement request shall be for those expenses incurred during the time period of March 1, 2020 through and including July 31, 2020, related to the COVID-19 public health emergency from the Iowa COVID-19 Government Relief Fund in the amount of \$ TBD in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency. ## Why This Is Important

We moved into a home on Stagecoach Trail a little over a year ago and love it here. As you might be aware, over the weekend, our neighborhood woke up Sunday morning to fliers in their front doors from a white supremacy group. We were skipped but from speaking with other neighbors, most of the houses received a flier. The neighborhood is disturbed and a little rattled from it. My understanding is that these fliers have been distributed several times in the past few years including Tugfest and this being the second time this summer. We can all agree that hate speech and racism is not welcome in LeClaire. But I think as a City Council it is important to understand how a white supremacy group uses fliers to see why they pose a danger to our community.

Incidents of white supremacist material being spread across the US rose by 120% in 2019.  
(Anti-Defamation League)

They use patriotic language and heroic imagery to raise your curiosity and motivate you to go to their website. When printed in black and white, it provides an even greater chance of passing under that radar. In this way it's a tool for recruitment. These fliers, when distributed repeatedly, are used as a litmus test in a community. If they can canvass neighborhoods and public spaces unchallenged, they believe they have found an audience and can move forward with activities and more propaganda. At its most sinister, these fliers are used as a signal to other neo-nazi members. They use social media to post anonymous images of where the fliers are as a way to hold or quickly disband flash demonstrations.

It's important when this propaganda appears in LeClaire, even on doorsteps or car windshields, for leaders to publicly condemn it. In cities like San Francisco or Muncie, IN mayors publicly condemning white supremacist fliers and graffiti led a effective community-wide response making it unfavorable for neo-nazi groups to operate there.

We have seen these fliers several times in LeClaire. They are targeting and testing us. On behalf of my neighborhood and our wonderful community, I am asking the individual City Council members, Mayor Allen, and Chief Themas to make public statements condemning any hate speech and activity by neo-nazi groups in LeClaire. Speak out and publicly let it be known that hate is not tolerated in LeClaire so they are deterred from further action.


## FROM COLLECTING MUSSELS TO USING MUSCLE TO COLLECT GARBAGE

The Mississippi River was literally Chad Pregracke's back yard while growing up near East Moline, IL. The son of educators and river enthusiasts, KeeKee and Gary Pregracke, Chad and his older brother, Brent, spent the majority of their time on, in and around the Mississippi and Illinois Rivers. Between his childhood and first job as a clam digger, it didn't take long before realizing that he didn't like what he saw - above or below the river - and decided to do something about it.

## WHAT STARTED AS 'ONE RIVER, ONE PIECE OF GARBAGE AT A TIME' TURNED INTO LIVING LANDS & WATERS FULL TIME

At the age of 17, Chad started making calls to government agencies to notify them of the problem, assuming someone would take care of it. Year after year passed by and the problem only worsened. In 1997, Chad decided that if no one else was going to clean up the river, he would.

In 1998 at the age of 23, Chad founded Living Lands & Waters. Today, the organization has grown to include a full staff and fleet of equipment. The crew averages nine states a year along the Mississippi, Illinois and Ohio Rivers, as well as many of their tributaries. Most recently, Chad expanded the mission of the organization to include Student Educational Workshops, The MillionTrees Project, Adopt-a-River Mile, Invasive Species Removal and The Great Mississippi River Cleanup.

Chad's vision, charisma, non-stop work ethic and natural leadership abilities have garnered him an abundance of awards and honors over the years. Most notably, Chad was the recipient of the Jefferson Award for Public Service (America's version of the Nobel Prize) in June 2002. Chad accepted this award in the United States Supreme Court in Washington D.C. with other award recipients Rudolph Giuliani, Bill and Melinda Gates and Lilly Tartikoff. In 2013, he was named CNN's Hero of the Year. Chad is also the author of *From the Bottom Up: One Man's Crusade to Clean America's Rivers*.


