


2019 FIRECHIEF REPORT



Our firefighter/EMT's responded to 435 calls in 2019 as compared to 434 calls in 2018.

In 2019 the LeClaire Fire Department remained one of the busiest volunteer department in Scott County. Our greatest number of calls came during the mid-day hours between 8am-4pm totaling 196 calls. These mid-day hours are when we have the least volunteers available, often requiring the assistance of mutual aid and delayed response times.

Our department currently consists of 20 active members including 3 probationary firefighters. Our current medical staffing includes 1 EMT-Paramedics, 2 EMT-Basics, and 3 Emergency Medical Responders. 2 of our probationary firefighters are currently taking Firefighter I training requirements and all 3 are on track to become full members in 2020.

In 2019, LeClaire Fire Department provided 4,495 volunteer hours to the community including training (1,242hrs), cleaning (109hrs), maintenance (107hrs) and calls (1,741hrs). 468hrs were spent on meetings and administrative duties. We hosted our annual fire prevention open house (434hrs) and participated in local events in our community including Tug Fest (394hrs).

The LeClaire Fire Department maintained an ISO rating of 4 out of 10 (10 being the least amount of protection). By maintaining a rating of 4, the community benefits from lowered insurance costs.
